New Courses

CHN 310 China Summer Study Abroad Program

6-7 hours

A five-week program providing language and culture instruction at Shanghai University in Shanghai, China. Students may participate without prior knowledge of Chinese. Language courses will be offered at all levels. The program will be taught by a Truman State University faculty member and professors of Shanghai University. The students will take field trips, visit museums and historic sites in Shanghai and near Shanghai. They will also have daily language lessons. During the first week, students will visit the capital city of China: Beijing. The city of Beijing, the Great Wall, the Forbidden City, and the Summer Palace will be visited. NOTE: This course fulfills the Foreign Language and Intercultural Interconnecting Perspectives of the Liberal Studies Program.

GRE 301 The Sacred Feminine: Goddesses and Mortal Women in Ancient Greece

3 hours

The Sacred Feminine: Goddesses and Mortal Women in Ancient Greece is a three-credit Study Abroad course. The course traces the feminine origins of several religious sites in the Greek world, and compares and contrasts ancient attitudes to goddesses and mortal women (both historical and literary). Students focus on understanding sacred sites such as the Athenian Acropolis, the Oracle of Delphi, and Aphrodite's Temple at Corinth within their archaeological, economic, historical, military, and social context, and especially through the lens of gender. NOTE: This course fulfills the Intercultural Interconnecting Perspective of the Liberal Studies Program.
